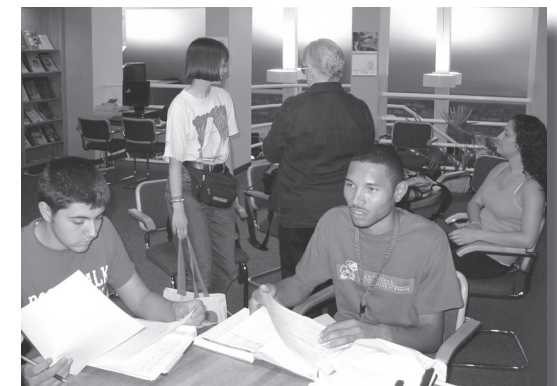

## School of Journalism Diversity Requirement

On Feb. 17, 2006, the faculty of the University of Kansas William Allen White School of Journalism and Mass Communications voted to have a diversity requirement to demonstrate that each journalism graduate has "...an understanding of the value of a diverse society, a diverse workplace and the importance of reflecting that diversity in mass media." This is a commitment made in the J-School's mission statement.

The University of Kansas has as one of its Goals of General Education that each graduate will "understand and appreciate the development, culture, and diversity of the United States and of other societies and nations."

The diversity requirement applies to students new to KU in fall 2007 and thereafter.

## MEETING THE REQUIREMENT

The diversity requirement may be met in **ONE** of the following **SEVEN** ways. Be sure to check the prerequisite courses for each course listed.
